#### **Grant Submissions:**

We are pleased to announce that we have multiple grant submissions under our belt. Below is a quick snapshot but please do not hesitate to contact me if you would like any additional information.

- WOW Study (primary focus is on APHAs)
   Indigenous People in Canada are disproportionately affected by HIV, yet interventions to support their health are commonly based on Western ways of knowing. Land-based approaches to wellness and to HIV research are urgently needed to support Indigenous People living with HIV.
- Mobilizing Indigenous Community-led HIV and AIDS Research to Impact Policy and Advance New Knowledge

This proposal seeks support to engage researchers, writers, policy analysts, among others, to work collaboratively and collectively in developing high quality articles for submission to peer-reviewed journals, including open access journals with high impact factors.

- Indigenous Approaches to Wellness
  - Information sharing is a two-way exchange: the wellness of Indigenous Peoples not only hinges on the information that is shared, but also on the **ways** in which that information is packaged and delivered. If messages are not properly articulated, communities will not receive them. There is a need to invest in a well-informed, evidence-based, culturally safe and passionate response to HIV and related issues that shifts from disparities to equities in health of Indigenous Peoples.
- We also supported the **TransPULSE** National Project submission.
